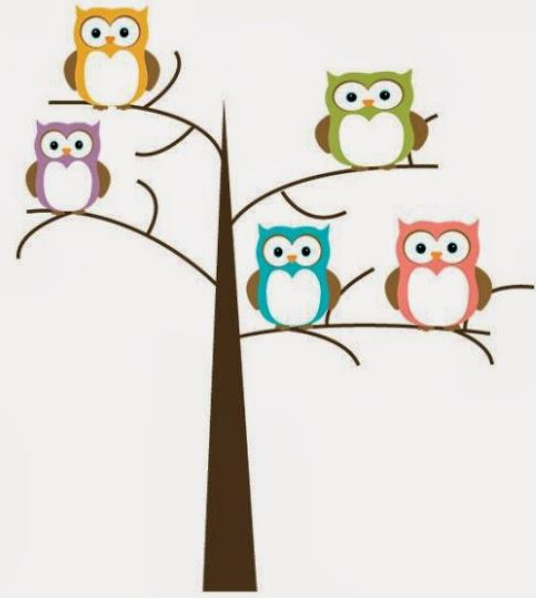

5 minutes late every day = a day missed every half term



Good Attendance gives your child the best start

- **90%=19 days=4 weeks=100 lessons missed**
- **80%=38 days=8 weeks=200 lessons missed**
- **70%=57 days=11.5 weeks=290 lessons missed**

Absence reporting

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 13th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. <i>For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.</i>	5 consecutive days of term time leave Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. (not leaving days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was meant to be absent for term time leave).
First Offence The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child (paid within 28 days) Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.	10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.
	Second Offence (within 3 years) The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child (paid within 28 days).
Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years) The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. <i>Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court, can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.</i>

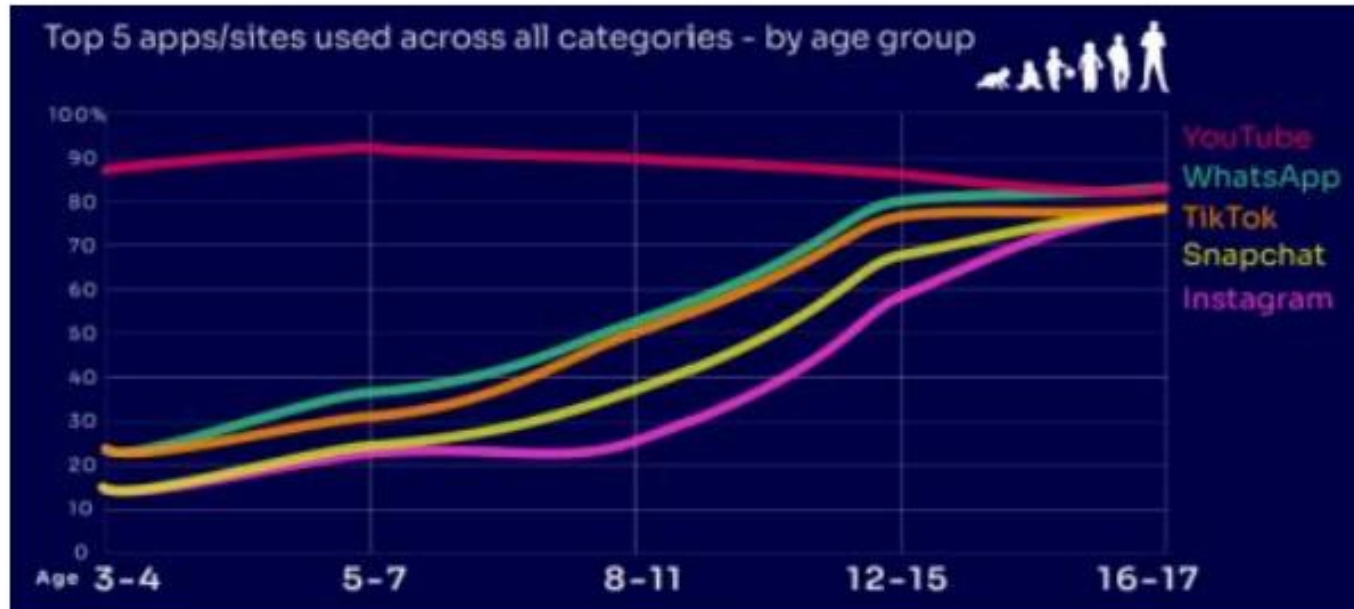

Keep it simple!



- **Label** uniform, coats, sandwich boxes & water bottles
- All children must now wear a white shirt with a tie. No polo shirts.

- Long hair tied back & small bows in school colours, **no extreme hair** styles.

Safeguarding Paws

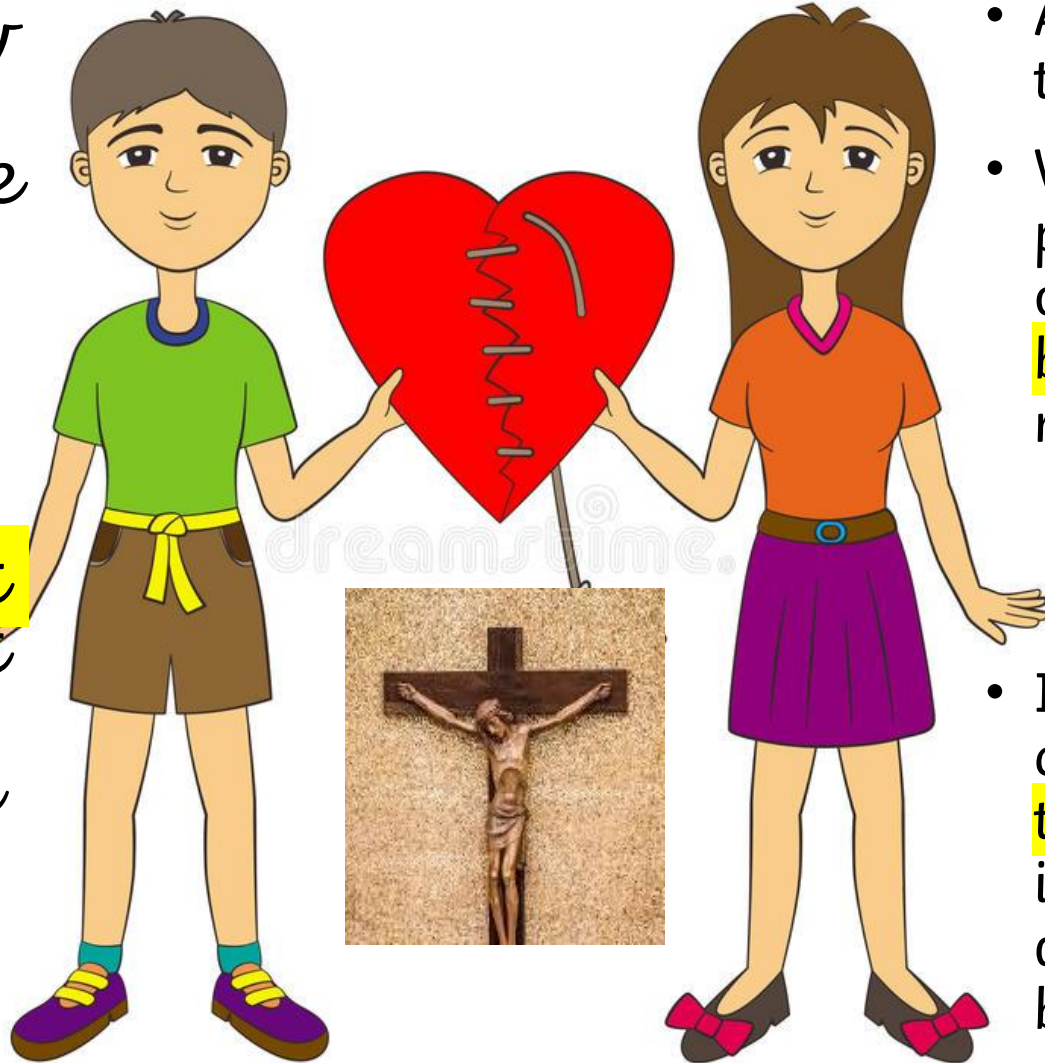

Things to remember.....

- Every day is a new day! This is important if we are showing true forgiveness.
- Please help your child to be resilient – they need to sort out their own disagreements and come to a resolution. This is a life skill



- Everyone – child/staff/parents can make a mistake...
- A child receiving a 'red' is not the end of the world!
- We work hard with children, parents and peers if we see or hear about bullying behaviours, taking a restorative approach.
- If you have a concern please come straight to your child's teacher so that we can investigate further – we always have your child's best interests at heart.

Rewards...



- Track-it Points in each lesson
- Certificates for 100, 200, 300, 500...points
- House points collated weekly
- Star of the Week receives a certificate & Tea with Mrs K and the School Dogs in the staffroom
- Eco, Digital, Liturgy
- Millie Moments
- Class rewards for Attendance & Punctuality
- Team points
- Once the whole class reaches 800 points, they earn reward time.
- Focus on positive praise – children receive lots of greens and we celebrate the good!

Behaviour



- Orange/Yellow/Red
- Red is for more serious incidents and children will receive a suitable and meaningful consequence
- Exclusion is rare but sometimes necessary e.g. *Intentional* physical
- Sometimes children need more individual support to ensure good behaviour
- We cannot share information about other children and we need your support
- If other parents report things to you please let us know
